CRITICAL INCIDENT

Incident Briefing

On Saturday evening at approx. 9 PM, our officers were dispatched to the Best Western Plus for a report of a "shooting". They met with a female complainant who stated that her boyfriend/common law husband had threatened her at his residence (Doc Holiday Dr. in the Saddle Ridge subdivision). Her vehicle appeared to have four "fresh" bullet holes in it. At that point, our officers (Ofc. R. Garcia & Ofc. A. Lopez) called in myself and Sgt. D. Lopez to assist. We determined that she was threatened and then fled the residence in her car, he followed her up 35 and somewhere in the area between Lucky Rd. and Sheppard Rd. He pulled along side her and fired a handgun at her, striking the vehicle at least 4 times (she was not injured). At this point we had Bexar Co. dispatch a deputy to our location. She wanted to go back to the house to pick up their 3-year-old son, who was sleeping when she left. Also, he had a 14-year-old daughter there. By now he had returned to the residence.

Based on threats he had made and his recent attempt to shoot the victim, we were in fear for the safety of the children in the house. We started making calls for assistance, as we knew this situation could turn bad very quickly. We had the Atascosa Co. Sheriff's Tactical Team respond to assist, also we were assisted by Texas DPS Highway Patrol Troopers and a Game Warden (who responded to the initial call). SAPD assisted by sending their Hostage Negotiator Unit and their SWAT Team. We got a big response because they were all on duty for the parade in S.A.

SAPD's Hostage Negotiator Unit set up communication with the suspect and after several hours he surrendered peacefully. The children were unharmed. Bexar Co. Sheriff's had sent down there CID and Crime scene units and had been dealing with the victim. They determined they would arrest him for the Aggravated assault with a deadly weapon (shooting at her). He was taken by them and booked into the Bexar County Jail. We also have terroristic threat charges we will most likely be filing on him as well.

The scene was clear by 2:30 AM, Mayor Gonzales arrived on scene at approximately 1 AM and had been briefed during the initial call. *** The end result was a successful operation, no one was injured***. We could not have done this without the assistance of our partner agencies.
