Our E-Bikes are on the road and really expand our bike patrol operations. Other big news ... The grant we received from the Federal Government will allow us to add a full-time position for a total of 12 sworn peace officers! I have included more information on these topics in this newsletter. Homes are popping up like weeds in both Saddle Ridge and Rosewood Estates. There are lots of new people moving to town. We have added a lot of streets, and I must admit, I am still trying to remember street names and be able to find them without using the map on my phone. I didn't think I would ever say that! Two Electric Assisted Bikes Added to Our Fleet to Expand Patrol Options



Capt. Dear & Chief Priest, Debut our new E-Bikes at the Lytle I.S.D. Veterans Day Parade on Nov. 11

While we have utilized bicycles for many years, the rapid growth on "the other side of IH 35" has forced us to re-evaluate our alternative patrol options. We've looked at UTV, Golf Cars, etc., and settled on E-Bikes. After researching numerous options, we selected Recon Power Bikes out of Fort Wayne, Indiana. With electric assist, we can cover a huge area, respond to calls, and not get "worn out". Our plan is to deploy them to all areas of the city, and they will be especially valuable in our new subdivisions. The bikes will be great for both night and day operations. Currently, we have six officers certified in bike patrol. As our agency grows, we hope to have regularly scheduled bike patrols.

Lytle City Council Approves Drone Lease

In November the Lytle City Council approved a two-year lease agreement with Unmanned Vehicle Technologies for a DJI Matrice 30T Drone. Currently, a team of 4 officers will begin training to obtain the required FFA license to operate the drone. This piece of equipment will provide another tool to help keep our community safe and provide the services that our citizens deserve.

Our city received a grant to help supplement the cost of an additional Police Officer position (DOJ - COPS grant). We appreciate the help of Congressman Henry Cuellar, EMC Strategy Group (our grant writers), City Administrator Zach Meadows, Finance Director LaNet Hester, Mayor Ruben Gonzalez & City Council, and other community partners. The \$112,500 award will go towards partially paying the salary of a new Police Office position over a three-year period.

We are very fortunate that Camino Real Community Services (https://www.caminorealcs.org) offered this 24-Hour Class to our department. Camino Real Community Services is a non-profit organization providing mental, behavioral, and intellectual disability services to Atascosa, Dimmit, Frio, Karnes, La Salle, Maverick, McMullen, Wilson, and Zavala counties. Camino Real is the designated Community Mental Health Authority and the Authority for Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities. Their administrative headquarters is located in Lytle! Stephen Moore is their Law Enforcement Liaison Officer, and he the course instructor. In addition to our six officers, there were also two Atascosa Co. Deputy Sheriffs and two Pleasanton Police Officers. The course was provided free of charge, and it was held at the Horace Fincher Annex at our Community Center. A big "Thank You!" goes out to Camino Real for providing this training.

Two Officers Complete 40 Hour Bicycle Patrol Certification Course

The course was held at the San Antonio College First Responder Academy just north of us on IH-35 (how convenient!).
