ORDINANCE NO. 405

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LYTLE ESTABLISHING A SPEED HUMP ON JUAREZ ST.; AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF LYTLE; REPEALING CONFLICTING PROVISIONS OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF LYTLE; AND PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE.

WHEREAS: A traffic study conducted by the City of Lytle's Police Department indicates the need for a speed hump on Juarez St.; and,

WHEREAS: Section 311.002 of the Texas Transportation Code authorizes a general-law municipality to regulate a highway, street or alley of the municipality; and,

WHEREAS: Juarez St. is under the jurisdiction of the City of Lytle; and,

WHEREAS: Section 51.001 of the Texas Local Government Code authorizes the governing body of a municipality to adopt, publish, amend or repeal an ordinance, rule or police regulation that is for the good government, peace or order of the municipality or for the trade and commerce of the municipality and is necessary or proper for carrying out a power granted by law to the municipality; and,

WHEREAS: The City of Lytle is a Type A General-Law city organized under the laws of the State of Texas;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LYTLE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Speed Hump Location. There is hereby established a speed hump on Juarez St. at the location indicated by the traffic study conducted by the Lytle Police Department.

SECTION 2. <u>Amendment</u>. The City of Lytle's Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to designate a speed hump on Juarez St. at the location indicated by the traffic study conducted by the Lytle Police Department.

SECTION 3. <u>Code of Ordinances</u>. It is the intention of the City Council that this Ordinance shall become a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lytle and may be renumbered and codified therein accordingly.

SECTION 4. Repeal. Any provision in the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lytle that conflicts with this ordinance is hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

SECTION 6. <u>Severability</u>. If any section, provision, subdivision, clause or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged or held unconstitutional or invalid, it shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any other part or provision contained herein.
